- Registration Fee: \$550

This includes the cost of your official Miss Volunteer America sash with the title of your choice. You may pay in installments, and once an installment is paid, you will be able to select your title for competition. To sign up, visit our website.

- Eligibility Requirements:
  - Contestants must be at least 17 years old and a high school graduate by July 1, 2026. Contestants must not be older than 26 on the day she signs up to compete.
- All contestants are responsible for their own housing. We have a host hotel with a block of rooms reserved, if you would like more information on that. Miss Contestants under the age of 21 must stay with a family member. You will need to provide your own transportation to and from rehearsals, etc. during pageant week.
- We will allow you to bring your own hair/make-up artist. After we receive all of your paperwork and entry fee, an e-mail will be sent to you with these details.
- A wardrobe information sheet can be provided to you upon request once confirmed.
- We will be glad to connect you with any resources that help you prepare and feel your
  absolute best when you come to compete with us. Our mission is to ensure that all
  contestants feel confident in their ability to compete, WIN, and become Miss Mississippi



## THE PAGEANT COMPETITION



TALENT 25%
INTERVIEW 25%
EVENING GOWN 25%
FITNESS & WELLNESS 25%

ONLY THE TOP 5 WILL ANSWER AN ON-STAGE QUESTION. THE JUDGES WILL OBSERVE, NOT SCORE, THE ANSWERS.

#### **Pageant Competition Details:**

- **Interview** This will be a 10-minute total interview with 8.5 minutes of questions from the panel of judges. There will be 90 seconds at the end for you to finish answering any questions, give a closing statement, or emphasize why you should be the next Miss Mississippi Volunteer.
- **Evening Gown** Focus on the first impression! This phase is designed to feature the young woman wearing the dress rather than the dress itself. Judges will consider your composure, confidence, personality, poise, and stage presence.
- **Talent** You will have 90-seconds to perform your talent.
  - Can be a dance, comedy, athletic skill demonstrations, vocal performance, monologue, instrumental performance, career demonstration or interest, baton twirling, operatic performance, illusion performance, ventriloquism, performance art, avocation.
- **Swimsuit** Onstage swimsuit competition is designed to demonstrate your commitment to a healthy lifestyle and will be judged based on your confidence on stage, display of charisma, and dedication to mind-body balance, but *not* on a contestant's size or shape.



## THE PAGEANT COMPETITION

#### **REGARDING INTERVIEW:**

The panel of judges will receive the resume-style paperwork that you will submit for them to learn more about you, prior to your interview. The paperwork will also include prompts about your S.E.R.V.E. initiative, platform, or community service work.

In addition to this, they will be provided with the Miss Volunteer America job competencies set forth by the national organization. These include example questions related to each competency.

We suggest that you cultivate some talking points for things that you want to mention in your interview.

The Miss Mississippi Volunteer interview **will not** include any political questions or topics, unless brought-up by you!


#### **FOR YOUR PLATFORM:**

"S.E.R.V.E. Initiative" is used by the Miss Volunteer America organization to describe a contestant's philanthropic platform work. This can be a community service project/group that you can volunteer with or a cause that you advocate for and work with.
